

**<u>COUNCIL OF ELDERS</u>**: The Peoples Church is looking for members who would like to serve as an elder or a member of the Nominations Committee:

**Council of Elders (Three-year term):** The Elder Council is responsible for the spiritual, physical, and overall welfare of the church. The council is comprised of 15 members, the clerk, and the treasurer, all of which are elected from active members of the church at the annual Fall Election Meeting. In addition, there is one representative selected from each denomination. The typical meeting schedule of the council includes a ministry meeting on the second or third Tuesday of each month, and the elders' meeting on the fourth Tuesday of each month. Elders are elected to serve a three-year term and can serve two terms consecutively. New members take office January 1.

**Nomination Committee:** The Nomination Committee is comprised of eight members and typically meets annually in August to recruit and select candidates for the Elder Council and the Nomination Committee slate for the congregation to vote on during the Fall Election Meeting. Members are selected to serve two-year terms, and must take a year off before serving again on the committee.

<u>UNDIE SUNDAYS</u>: Undie Sundays are returning, collection begins June 11 and ends August 13. Community Engagement will be collecting <u>NEW</u> underwear (underpants, socks, & tees) children, K-12.
