"What's your vision for the church?"

I've been asked that question at least once a week since I arrived at The Peoples Church in October. After all, I am the new Senior Pastor and the spiritual head of the congregation. Surely I must be ready to tell the members and staff where we are heading in 2020. Right?

Some ministers will start a new call by making sweeping changes, using the "honeymoon" period as an opportunity to put their particular stamp on a congregation. Experience has taught me that this requires a certain kind of ministerial arrogance that I neither possess nor aspire to. Personally, I am suspicious of people who think they know what's best for me if they don't know me. Isn't that also true for congregations?

Let me be honest: I didn't accept this call because I had a master plan for the future of The Peoples Church. I accepted this call because I felt God was calling me to this place for a reason—a reason God would reveal in time. That's how God works: accept the call, details will follow.

When God called Abraham, God did not offer much in the way of details, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you." (Genesis 12:1) Instead, God asked Abraham to trust in the Lord. The same was true for Moses. God's voice spoke to Moses from the burning bush and said, "So come, I will send you to Pharaoh to bring my people, the Israelites, out of Egypt." (Exodus 3:10) Moses asked for more details, but God only promised to be with him and revealed the name: I Am. Even in the New Testament, Mary agreed to bear Jesus based on very sketchy details. We accept God's call based on WHO God is, not based on what God is offering.

Once we accept God's call, then God begins to reveal the details.

I cannot tell you what my vision is for this church, but together, we will discern the details of God's vision for us through reflection, prayer and conversation. Together, we will examine the resources of this church and how we utilize them to further God's mission. Together, we will identify missed opportunities and assess the spiritual needs of this community. Together, we will live by faith, act with intention, and articulate what it means to be The Peoples Church in 2020 and beyond.

My prayer for 2020 is that I can inspire this congregation to speak God's word and do God's work for we are the body of Christ in this place and time. What's my vision for 2020? To figure out what God's vision for the church is and just do it.

May God bless us all in this new year!

OVERNIGHT BLUEBERRY FRENCH TOAST

INGREDIENTS:

- 12 slices day-old bread, cut into 1-inch cubes
- 2 (8 ounce) packages cream cheese, cut into 1 inch cubes
- 1 cup fresh blueberries
- 12 eggs, beaten
- 2 cups milk
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/3 cup maple syrup
- 1 cup white sugar
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch
- 1 cup water
- 1 cup fresh blueberries
- 1 tablespoon butter

DIRECTIONS:

Lightly grease a 9x13 inch baking dish. Arrange half the bread cubes in the dish, and top with cream cheese cubes. Sprinkle 1 cup blueberries over the cream cheese, and top with remaining bread cubes.

In a large bowl, mix the eggs, milk, cinnamon, vanilla extract, and syrup. Pour over the bread cubes. Cover, and refrigerate overnight.

Remove the bread cube mixture from the refrigerator about 30 minutes before baking. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F.

Cover, and bake 30 minutes. Uncover, and continue baking 25 to 30 minutes, until center is firm and surface is lightly browned.

In a medium saucepan, mix the sugar, cornstarch, and water. Bring to a boil. Stirring constantly, cook 3 to 4 minutes. Mix in the remaining 1 cup blueberries. Reduce heat, and simmer 10 minutes, until the blueberries burst. Stir in the butter, and pour over the baked French toast
