ON MY MIND: MANY GIFTS, ONE SPIRIT

The Apostle Paul often compares the church to the human body, particularly in 1 Corinthians 12. He was writing to a church that was in a bit of a crisis: people were vying for power and position in the structure of the church and it was undermining the community. Even Paul recognized there was a sort of hierarchy in the church ("And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers..." v. 28) but he admonished the members of the church to recognize that every gift came from the same Spirit. And while some people had gifts that were considered "more honorable," every gift was important to the overall functioning of the body (aka community). Everyone needs to exercise their gifts in order for the church to do God's work.

Reading this passage, I nod in recognition. Every church I have served has struggled with the same thing: there are some tasks or jobs in a church that no one wants to do. Usually it involves cleaning up after an event—or serving on committees. I get it. No one wants to stick around and wipe down tables after everyone else has gone home, and no one wants to give up a free evening to sit in a meeting to discuss Sunday school curriculum or the number of ushers needed for Christmas Eve. We've all got better places to be, better things to do.

But experience has taught me that, while people may not volunteer to do certain tasks in a church, they rise to the occasion when asked. So I am asking.

We need people who have a gift and passion for working with college students to help us with Campus Ministry. This church was founded by professors who hoped The Peoples Church would always be a source of religious education and Christian inspiration for students and faculty. If we are to continue this mission, we need people with these gifts to come forward.

While Covid-19 prevents the choir from singing, we can still have a bell choir...but we need ringers. Even if you've never played in a bell choir, if you can read music, you can play bells. Is this a gift you're willing to share?

Our congregation is multi-generational and some of our oldest members are feeling isolated and alone these days. We are looking for people who might be willing to help us stay in touch with our home bound members through a ministry of phone calls and cards. Perhaps this is one of your spiritual gifts.

We often talk about the importance of sharing our financial gifts with the church, but sharing the gift of time is of equal importance. There is no ministry in this church that would not benefit from having more volunteers, more people willing to share their gifts to build up this Body of Christ.

KICK-OFF SUNDAY: SEPTEMBER 13!

September 13 is Kick Off Sunday—the day we celebrate the start of a new church year. Normally, the sanctuary would be full of people returning from summer vacations, the calendar would be crowded with new and returning programs, and the choir would inspire us with a rousing anthem. That's what we would do in a normal year. Unfortunately, this year is far from normal. In the midst of a pandemic, Kick Off Sunday will be a little different.

While we will not have a full choir, we plan to have a quartet of singers who will bless us with the gift of music. Sunday school may still be virtual, but there will be new curriculum and activities for children (and families) to do at home. We are also hoping to install new cameras so that the live stream of worship is more visually interesting (that may take a bit longer, but the day is surely coming...thus saith the Lord).

Although we will continue to live stream the 10:30 a.m. worship service, we have room in the sanctuary for 160 socially distanced attendees. Masks are required and singing is not encouraged, but you are welcome to come join us in person if you feel it is right for you. We will only have one service (at 10:30) until we feel there is enough interest in an 8:30 a.m. service.

One last thing: you may recall that in June I mentioned we would be making some changes to liturgy in the fall. On Kick Off Sunday, the doxology will be updated to include the non-gendered trinity (Creator, Christ and Holy Ghost instead of Father, Son, Holy Ghost). I know it will take some practice to get used to this new language, but it will help us imagine God in God's wonderful fullness.

There is much to celebrate as we enter a new season. I hope that you will join us for worship (virtually or in person) and seek out new ways to grow in faith and serve God in Christ's name. That's the best way to celebrate the new church year!



The Preschool reopened for families on July 6. Prior to that the preschool staff worked hard to make alterations to our environment and to implement numerous safety features that would keep the children and staff members as safe as possible.


The second floor is currently only used by preschool staff, children and maintenance staff. Families and visitors are not permitted, to reduce the number of people in the preschool each day. Preschool administrators greet families in the Northwest Entrance every morning, both for drop off and pick up time.


Each staff member and child is screened each day to ensure they are in good health before attending preschool. Families are asked to screen their child's health, as well as, everyone in the family each day before the child is brought to the preschool.

Other safety precautions include the reduction in using shared spaces such as the gym and outdoor classroom, intermittent disinfecting of common touch points throughout the day, and providing materials for the children to use by themselves instead of in groups.

While it may look a little different, we still care for each child the same—with a loving heart and passion for teaching!
